

Short manual Twingo

Opening and disconnecting the charging cable.

Start the reservation and open the car with the app.
Then take the key from the tray in the middle under the dashboard.
That is the place where you would also put the coffee cup.
Unlock the charging cable by pressing 'open' on the car key.
Store the charging cable in the trunk.



Open the loading hatch.

The button to open the tailgate is hidden under the bulge in the middle of the rear window.

Starting and driving away.

Check that the gear lever is in the 'P' position.
Put the key in the ignition next to the steering wheel and turn to start. You should hear a pleasant sound indicating that the car is ready to drive.
Keep your foot on the brake and put the car in gear: there is a button under the head of the gear lever that you have to press. It does indeed take some force to move the lever.



En route.

If you want to make a stopover, put the gear lever in the 'P' position and remove the key from the ignition. Only use the key (not the app) to lock and open the car while on the road.

Charge on the go or upon return.

First, put the gear lever in the 'P' position and remove the key from the ignition. It is important that you connect the charging cable in the correct order: first connect the charging cable to the charging station and pass the charging token along the sensor.
Wait until the light on the station changes from green to blue.

Only then put the plug in the car. Then lock the car with the key to start charging. If all goes well, the light at the charging port of the car will then turn completely green and flash slowly.
If you look through the window, you will see small lines on the display at the odometer moving in the direction of the battery.
This can take a minute.



Upon return:

If you have started charging as described above, you can open the car again with the key. Charging will then continue as normal. Put the key in the tray and then lock the car with the app. It is true that the dashboard remains partially active. There is nothing you can do about that for the time being.
